





Day 5: God has given us genuine joy.

Read Romans 5:9-11, underlining every use of *reconciled*.

 Along with the benefits gained through faith in Jesus, what responsibilities do you also now carry?

I want to share something that has been on my heart lately, and I pray it challenges you. Don't overlook opportunities to share the gospel. A lot of people are feeling anxious, depressed, and overwhelmed. There is only one real hope for mankind: a relationship with God, through the work of Jesus, that is led by the Spirit. You don't have to physically touch anyone to share the best news a person could ever hear. The gospel is literally a matter of life and death.
